<u>July $8^{th} - 11^{th}$ – Aitkin County Fair -</u> Visit us at our air-conditioned Log Museum, located on the S.E. corner of the fairgrounds, where our faithful volunteers disseminate Aitkin County's history. Door prizes given away daily.

<u>July 17th & 18th – Annual Garage Sale-</u> Held at the Aitkin County Fairgrounds, this is one of our biggest fundraisers of the year. Garage sale items will be accepted, marked, and stored prior to the sale. Please call for details on how to donate your Tax Deductible items for this sale.

<u>September 18th, 19th, & 20th – Festival of Adventures – Held at Aitkin's</u> city park, Friday the 18th is for school children only. On Saturday & Sunday the public is invited to experience the sounds, sights, smells and tastes of a rendezvous. Come for the music, stay for the biscuits and gravy and fry bread at our booth.

<u>December 5th – Spirit of Christmas/Open House/Cookie Walk/Raffle –</u> Join us as we open our Depot Museum to cookie buyers and guests. Our special Christmas displays created by member and volunteer Jo White are always a treat to see.

NEW DISPLAYS

<u>Independent Order of Odd Fellows</u> (IOOF) Lodge #164 celebrates 120 years in Aitkin display. Come see old and new Regalia, Pins from Sovereign Grand Lodge sessions, Helmets, Old Photographs, Literature about the Lodge and much more.

<u>Do You Know Aitkin County?</u> Glory Township is now featured in this display. Part of the display shows some of the art work of Andrew (Andy) Bodin who grew up in Glory. One of the items is a picture of the Commemorative Coin he designed for the 1962 Seattle Worlds Fair.

<u>Dentistry</u> This display shows items used in a Dentists office from the past and some items from the present. Items in the display include an ANNEALER used to melt gold foil for fillings, old towel holders, and false teeth.

<u>Movie Display</u> This is a new display case in the hallway featuring a 1905 crank silent movie projector and film. Also included in the display is memorabilia from the Moveum and Rialto movie theaters.

<u>Boy Scouts in Aitkin display</u>. Display celebrates 85 years in Aitkin. Lists of all Scout Masters and Eagle Scouts are in the display along with many uniforms and other scouting items.

<u>Fashions 1860 - 2000</u> Many dresses are on display including an 1860 Brown Victorian 3 Piece Dress, 1913 Wool Full Length Coat of Emma Meggary, 1920's Flapper Dress, 1960's Hippie outfit and 2000 Black Satin Dress.

<u>Display case</u> Shows many necklaces, watches, bracelets (Snake Arm Bracelet) Rhinestone Jewelry, Bolero, Stole and Stockings.

APPLESAUCE CAKE

¹/₂ Cup Butter
1 ¹/₂ Cups Applesauce
1 Cup Chopped nuts
2 t. Soda

1 Cup Sugar ¹/₂ t. Cinnamon 1 t. Vanilla ¹/₄ t. Nutmeg 1 Egg ¹/₄ t. Cloves 2 Cups Flour ³/₄ Cup raisins

Cream butter and sugar; add a well beaten egg and vanilla. Add the rest of the ingredients. Bake at 350 degrees. Frost with powdered sugar frosting.

BROWNIES

Cup Sugar
 Can Hershey Syrup

Stick Margarine
 Cup Flour

4 Eggs

Mix together, bake at 350 degrees for $\frac{1}{2}$ hour.

FROSTING

³⁄₄ cup Sugar

3 T. Milk

3 T Butter

Bring to a slow boil and then boil for $\frac{1}{2}$ minute. Then add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of Semi Sweet Chocolate chips.
