I spent the last 9 years of my career at the Carver County Historical Society in Waconia, MN. As the Curator of Education and Exhibits, I was in charge of all educational programming and exhibit design, grant writing, social media, volunteer recruitment, and a large array of other tasks. The taxidermist who made the mount was Francis Lee Jaques, of Jaques Arts Center fame. Supposedly, the neck on this deer was so large, Jaques had to cut a large triangle portion of skin out, so it would look "normal" when mounted.
