COLLECTIONS & ASSESSMENTS UPDATE

Upon completion of a Building Conditions Assessment in 2021, the ACHS prioritized the recommended (and much needed) projects. It was decided that the leaky roof and lack of gutters was the biggest issue. The leaky roof was causing damage to original features of the historic building. The lack of gutters was damaging the historic paver surface and causing ice build-up and risk of falls in winter. Water damage from lack of proper site drainage was also causing pitting and an uneven walking surface in the paver plaza, making it dangerous for those with walking aids.

As gutters could not be re-installed until after roof repair, and both tied into water and site drainage issues, a combined project was conceived. A large size grant was applied for from MNHS. This was for the completion of architectural drawings and layouts of the restored roof, gutters and drainage, and a re-graded and re-laid paver surface. **The drawings are nearing completion**. The **next step will be** the writing of a grant for the actual work itself. As this will require a large sum, this will hopefully be supplemented with funding from other sources beyond MNHS Legacy grants, such as other grant sources and a capital fundraising campaign.

This building is over 100 years old. To remain the home of the ACHS, with the safety of the collection in our care and our visitors in mind, this project's completion is much needed.
